Leveraging Digital Technology for National Economic Development

**The Role of the Digital Economy in Developing and
Diversifying the Nigerian Economy
(August, 2019 to May, 2023)**



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1.0 Introduction

On the 21st of August 2019, **Prof Isa Ali Ibrahim (Pantami), FCIIS, FBCS, FNCS** was given the responsibility of leading the **Ministry of Communications**. He hit the ground running immediately and held a series of meetings with the Ministry and the parastatals under his supervision, with a view to understanding their current position with regard to the implementation of their mandates and to also cast his vision on the role he wants the Ministry to play in transforming the Nigerian economy.

The Honourable Minister observed that the Ministry's mandate had become obsolete and focused more on the deployment of Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs), rather than an adoption of a digital economy paradigm. **In a letter to Mr. President on the 12th of September 2019, the Honourable Minister made a case for the mandate of the Ministry to be expanded to include digital economy and also for the name of the Ministry to be changed from Ministry of Communications to Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy.**

Prof. Pantami argued that including the digital economy in the Ministry's mandate was in line with global best practice as promoted by the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and the European Union, among others. The Minister further argued that the name of the Ministry at the time reflected only one aspect of the mandate of the Ministry; the mandate of overseeing the provision of an appropriate channel for ICT services to thrive. By contrast, the proposed name Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy would give a more holistic reflection of the mandate of the Ministry; **communications addresses the channel, digital addresses the nature of the content and economy reflects the central focus of the activities of the Ministry, which is the development of the economy.**

Mr. President graciously approved the Honourable Minister's request to redesignate the Federal Ministry of Communications as the Federal Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy on the 17th of October, 2019. The change was officially endorsed at the Federal Executive Council on the 23rd of October, 2019 and the process of implementing a digital economy for the country began on the 24th of October, 2019, which was approved as the Digital Nigeria Day. This day also marked the official commencement of Nigeria's digital economy journey.

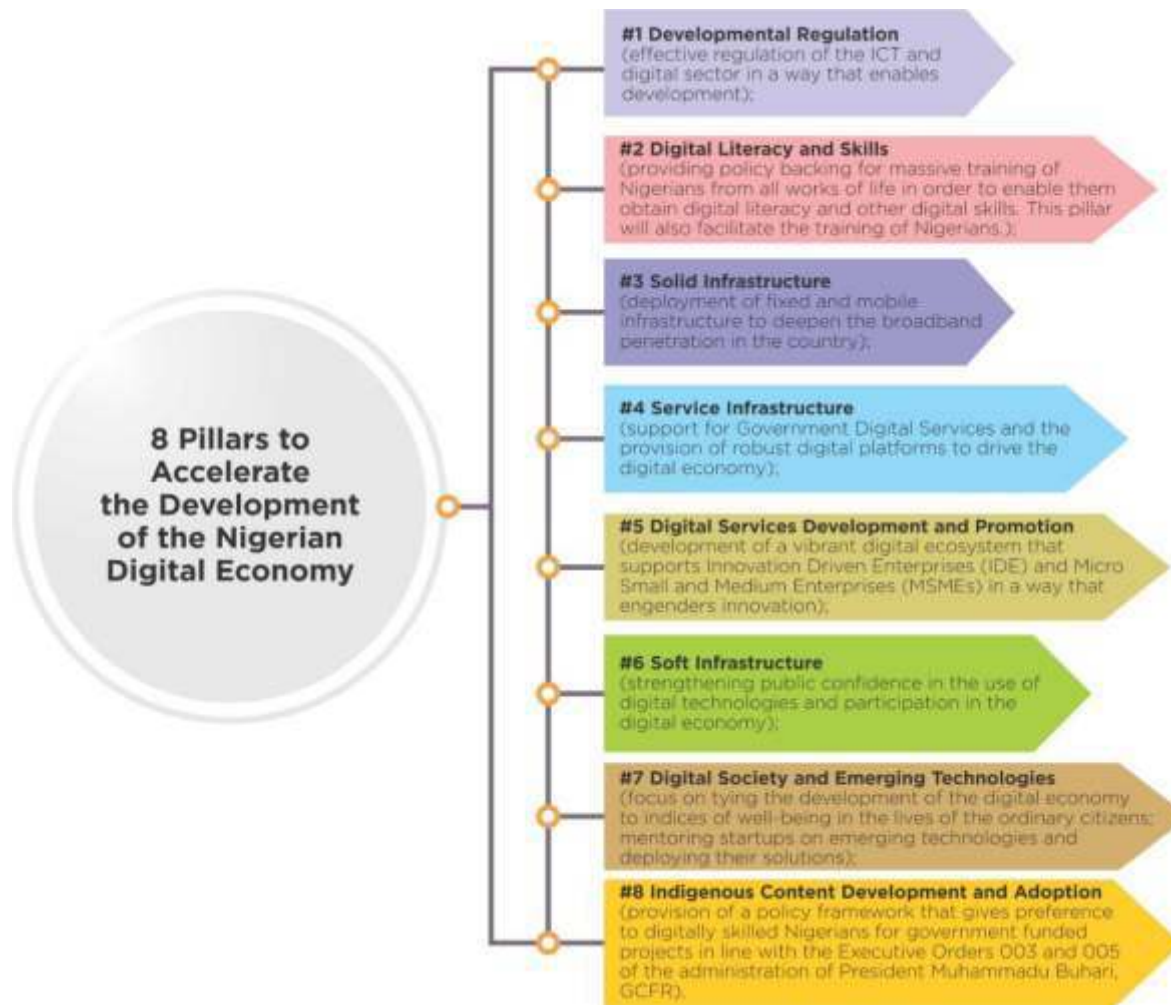


Fig. 1: Pillars of NDEPS

The Honourable Minister then led a team to develop the National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy (NDEPS) for a Digital Nigeria. The NDEPS was launched by President Muhammadu Buhari on the 28th of November, 2019. The document provides an overarching policy for the development of Nigeria's digital economy and it is made up of the following 8 pillars (See Fig. 1):

The implementation of the digital economy mandate has led to several initiatives, projects, policies and a number of unprecedented achievements. This document is a concise compendium of some of the key achievements of the sector under the leadership of Prof.

Pantami from August 2019 to May 2023. It provides a summary of the initiatives in the digital economy sector under the stewardship of the **Honourable Minister of Communications and Digital Economy, Professor Isa Ali Ibrahim (Pantami), FNCS, FBCS, FIIM**. The programmes, projects and initiatives have all followed the due process outlined in the relevant laws and regulations. It is also worthy of note that they have been sited and implemented with due consideration for geographical spread, value for money and capacity for impact, among others.

2.0 Ministerial Mandates

In order to institute a proper monitoring and evaluation mechanism, President Muhammadu Buhari assigned Ministerial Mandates to all the Ministers appointed to serve during his second term in office. For each of these mandates, baselines were identified and targets were assigned. The Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy was assigned 8 Ministerial Mandates, namely:

- i. Implementation of Broadband Connectivity;
- ii. Deployment of 4G across the country;
- iii. Digitalising Government functions and processes;
- iv. Development and implementation of a National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy;
- v. Implementation of a Digital Identity Programme;
- vi. Improvement and optimisation of revenues from all operators and licensees in the agencies under the Ministry's supervision;
- vii. Active collaboration with the Private Sector to create jobs; and
- viii. Empowerment of citizens.

In spite of the Honourable Minister's track record of exceeding any performance targets assigned to him, he generally averse to singing his own praises and prefers the beneficiaries of his service to objectively access his performance. This is why the Honourable

Minister was excited at the plan of the Federal Government to get international and independent institutions to assess the performance of all Ministers in the delivery of their mandates. The Federal Government, through the Office of the Secretary to the Government of the Federation, invited the Foreign, Commonwealth and Development Office (FCDO), United Kingdom and KPMG, among others to carry out the final assessment of the delivery of the Ministerial Mandates. The team carried out a detailed assessment and assigned 70% as the minimum score for the A-grade. The independent assessors assigned the following scores to the Minister for the different mandates:

- i. Implementation of Broadband Connectivity - 134%;
- ii. Deployment of 4G across the country - 127%;
- iii. Digitalising Government functions and processes - 99%;
- iv. Development and implementation of a National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy - 103%;
- v. Implementation of a Digital Identity Programme - 86%;
- vi. Improvement and optimisation of revenues from all operators and licensees in the agencies under the Ministry's supervision - 594%;
- vii. Active collaboration with the Private Sector to create jobs - 111%; and
- viii. Empowerment of citizens - 137%.

The performance of the Minister was adjudged the best in the country. Fig. 2 shows the status of some key deliverables in August 2019 and the transformation experienced within about 3 years.

A brief description of some of the key activities and achievements in the implementation of the 8 Ministerial Mandates are given in the sections that follow.

2.1 *Implementation of Broadband Connectivity*

As at August 2019, when the Minister assumed office, Nigeria had no valid Broadband Plan as the previous one had expired in 2018. Broadband is critical to sustainable economic growth and according to the International Telecommunications Union (ITU) Broadband Series, broadband contributes to economic growth through more efficiency in business processes, acceleration of innovation and more efficient functional deployment of enterprises. A Report titled "How Important Are Mobile Broadband Networks for Global Economic Development" shows that 10% increase in mobile broadband penetration results in approximately 0.6% to 2.8% rise in Gross Domestic Product (GDP). In some countries, it increases the GDP by over 6%.

Considering the fact that Broadband access is pivotal to the development of the digital economy and is a catalyst for the development of the traditional economy, the Honourable Minister sought the permission of Mr. President and set up a Committee of stakeholder experts to draft a new Plan. **The Nigerian National Broadband Plan (NNBP) was graciously unveiled and launched by His Excellency, President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR, on the 19th of March, 2020** (Fig. 3). The Plan, based on 4 pillars, (Fig. 4) is designed to deliver data download speeds across Nigeria of a minimum 25Mbps in urban areas, and 10Mbps in rural areas, with effective coverage available to at least 90% of the population by 2025 at a price not more than N390 per 1GB of data (i.e. 2% of median income or 1% of minimum wage).

As part of the support for the broadband plan, the Minister engaged the Nigeria Governors' Forum (NGF) on the 22nd of January 2020 (Fig. 5), the **Governors unanimously agreed to drop the Right of Way (RoW) charges to a maximum of ₦145 per linear metre.**

Following the Minister's intervention, some Governors even waived the fees altogether. It is worth noting that as at August 2019, some States even charged up to ₦14,000 per linear metre.

Broadband penetration was 33.7% in August 2019 and through the implementation of the NNBPP, the penetration increased significantly. In particular, through the intervention and approval of the Honourable Minister, the Nigerian Communications

Commission (NCC) issued a license to Starlink, a subsidiary of Space X, and this led to the provision of broadband access across the length and breadth of Nigeria, leading to **100% broadband coverage in January 2023, almost 3 years earlier than the 90% proposed coverage stated in the NNBP**. The Minister announced the partnership between Nigeria and Space X at the US Africa Leaders' Forum (USALF) in December 2022 (Fig. 6).

The cost of data dropped from ₦1,200 per GB in August 2019 to ₦350 (far earlier than the plan of making it ₦390 by December 2025). Furthermore, the estimated number of people living in the unserved and underserved areas declined from 33.7 million in 2015 to 31.16 million in 2019, while the number of clusters dropped from 207 to 114 during the period. Based on the outcome of the new study in 2022, the number of clusters has further dropped from 114 to 97 clusters with an estimated population of 27.91 Million.

In order to boost access to broadband for all strata of society, the Honourable Minister presented a memo at the Federal Executive Council (FEC). **The approval of the memo led to the approval of N41.6 billion to provide free unlimited broadband internet connectivity to 49 tertiary institutions, 20 airports, and six markets across the country.**

2.2 Deployment of 4G across the country

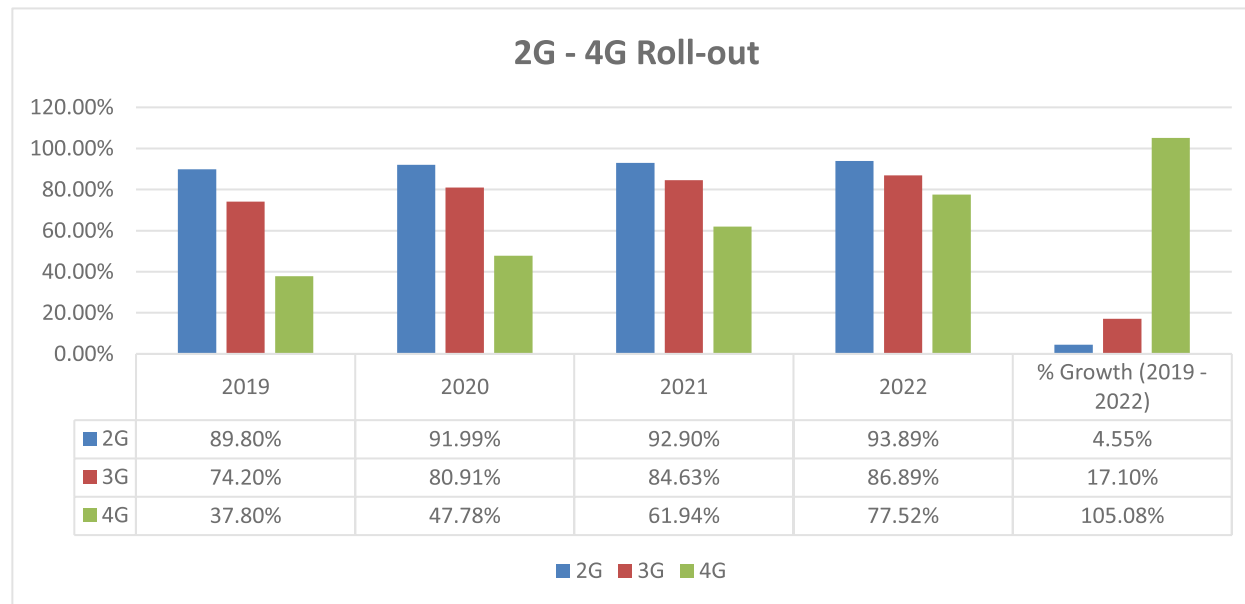


Fig. 7: The Growth of 2G, 3G and 4G Networks

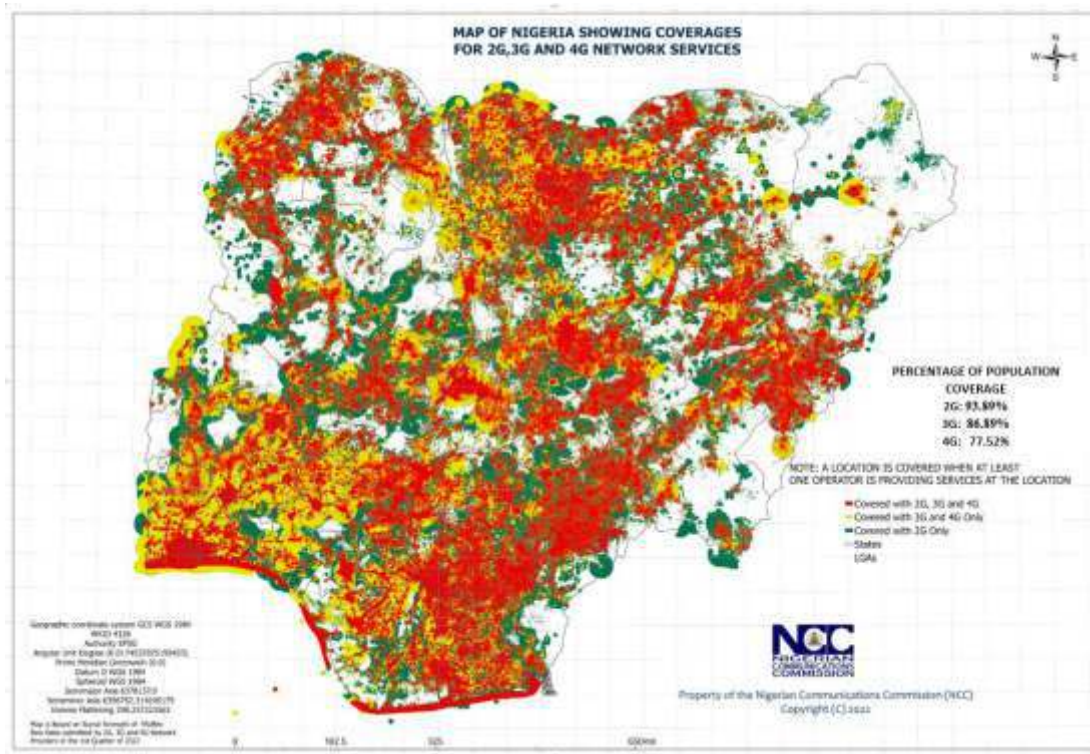


Fig. 8: The Spread of 2G, 3G and 4G Networks across the Country

One of the mandates assigned to the Minister was the deployment of 4G Networks. Fourth Generation (4G) Networks were introduced in 2009 as the successor to the Third Generation (3G) networks. 4G networks provide high-speed wireless communication with high voice quality, seamless access to the Internet and other benefits. The 2G, 3G and 4G penetrations all increased under the Honourable Minister's watch, by 4.55%, 17.10% and 105.08% as shown in Fig. 7 and Fig. 8.

However, in line with the Minister’s proactiveness and innovation, he went beyond the assigned 4G mandate and coordinated Fifth Generation (5G) trials, developed a **National 5G Policy**, auctioned the spectrum and supervised the commercial deployment of 5G across Nigeria. His Excellency, President Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR, unveiled and launched the National Policy on the 25th of January, 2022 as shown in Fig. 9. MTN, Mafab and Airtel all participated in the auction process and each obtained a lot of 100 MHz

from the 3.5GHz Spectrum after successfully participating in the auction process. **This generated \$820.8m for the Federal Government. 5G services are now available in in at least 760 sites across 17 states in Nigeria.**

The National 5G Policy is designed and formulated to achieve many goals, including:

- i. to ensure effective deployment of 5G to cover major urban areas by 2025;
- ii. to ensure security of 5G ecosystem and the protection of data;

- iii. to ensure that international best practices and globally accepted standards and specifications are entrenched in Nigeria's 5G ecosystem; and
- iv. to ensure that the required infrastructure needed for successful deployment of 5G networks such as data centres, power, etc, are catered for in deployment strategies of 5G networks.

Adopting 5G technologies and rolling out 5G networks is supporting the development of Nigeria's digital economy.

2.3 *Digitalising Government functions and processes*

Government Digital Services (GDS) enable the digitalising of government functions and processes. GDS is sometimes referred to as E-government and it entails the provision of robust digital platforms that enable citizens to move from physical to online interactions with government. Such interactions became very important as a result of the COVID-19. Digitalising the services goes beyond just digitisation. Digitisation merely refers to the conversion of analog to digital content, while digitalisation involves transformation of business processes through the integration of digital technologies. Digitalisation results in many benefits, including increased efficiency, greater revenue and the provision actionable insights from real-time data.

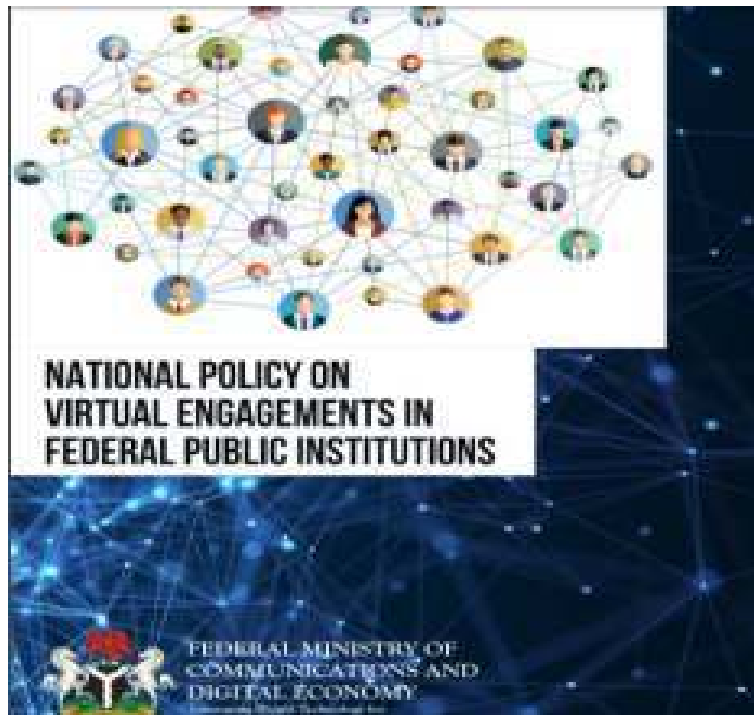


Fig. 10: Front Page of the National Policy on Virtual Engagements in Federal Public Institutions

To ensure that statutory government meetings do not stop as a result of the pandemic, the Honourable Minister developed the Policy in partnership with the Office of the Head Civil Service of the Federation. **The policy is known as the National Policy on Virtual Engagements for Federal Public Institutions (see Fig. 10) was unveiled on the 14th of October 2020. The Policy made it possible to formalise government online meetings.** As such, statutory meetings like the Federal Executive Council meetings, Council of State meetings and other meetings can now take place online, effectively and legally.

Data centres provide the infrastructure that houses the data and supports the provision of GDS. **On the 20th of December, President Muhammadu Buhari commissioned the National Shared Services Centre (NSSC). The Centre is a one-stop-shop for Ministries, Departments and Agencies to interface with the citizens in a way that is swift, secure and seamless.** The Centre houses a Data Centre, Cybersecurity Operations Centre, Network Centre, Call Centre and will provide office space, among others (Fig. 11). Furthermore, **Mr. President also commissioned the 41-terabyte national tier-4 Data Center in Kano on the 30th of January, 2023 (Fig.12).**

In addition to these, **President Muhammadu Buhari Friday in Abuja also inaugurated the Presidential Council on Digital Economy and E-government on the 10th of June, 2022** (Fig. 13). The Council is chaired by Mr. President and further directed the Honourable Minister of Communications and Digital Economy to Chair the Council on his behalf and provide regular updates to him.

In August 2019, the only valid policy document in the sector was the National E-government Masterplan and it was developed in partnership with the Government of South Korea. Under the leadership of Prof. Pantami, the Masterplan was faithfully implemented. As part of this partnership and implementation, over 1,400 Nigerian public servants were trained in both Nigeria and South Korea on e-governance. A world-class E-Government Training Centre was also handed over to the Federal Government in November 2019.

The Honourable Minister's penchant for making good things better was evident in this project as brokered a deal that led to the development and signing of Phase II of the e-government Master Plan and the revised project was entitled "Project for Building Foundations Towards Digital Governance in Nigeria (2020-2026)." **The Republic of South Korea is to spend 13 million U.S. dollars on the second phase of the Nigerian e-Government national master plan.** Fig. 14 shows the signing ceremony where the Honourable Minister signed for Nigeria, while Mr Woochan Chang, Country Director, Korea International Cooperation Agency (KOICA), signed for South Korea.

Furthermore, the National ICT Infrastructure Backbone (NICTIB) 1 and 2 projects were also implemented to provide fibre infrastructure across the country. NICTIB focused on South-South, South-East and South-West, while NICTIB II focused more on the Northern part of the country.

2.4 *Development and implementation of a National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy*

As mentioned earlier, the National Digital Economy Policy and Strategy (NDEPS) is the overarching policy for the development of Nigeria's digital economy. The impact of the implementation of the NDEPS transcended the digital economy of the country and extended to the traditional economy as well.

For instance, the Information and Communications Technology (ICT) sector had 3 unprecedented highest ever contributions to the Gross Domestic Product (GDP); in Q1 2020 (14.07%), in Q2 2021 (17.92%) and in Q2 2022 (18.44%). The ICT sector was the fastest growing sector in both the fourth quarter of 2020 and the entire year 2020, based on the Report by the National Bureau of Statistics.

The sector's 14.70% double digit growth rate played a principal role in supporting our country to exit the recession triggered by the COVID-19 pandemic a year faster than experts predicted. The growth rate of the sector exceeded 4 times the next fastest growing sector of Q4 2020, which had a growth rate of 3.42%. **The 14.70% growth rate of the ICT sector was greater than the combined 14.21% growth of the 2nd to 7th fastest growing sectors in 2020.** The telecommunications sector also recorded a growth rate of 15.90% and this was its highest growth rate in the last 10 years. The Digital Economy sector has proven to be vital for the diversification of the Nigerian economy.

In addition to the development of NDEPS, a number of additional policies were developed under the supervision of the Minister. A list of some of the main policies is given below:

Additionally, as part of the development of the digital economy ecosystem, **over 2,000 projects and programmes were initiated from August 2019 to date**. A number of these projects are listed in this compendium.

2.5 *Implementation of a Digital Identity Programme*

Digital identity is well regarded as the fabric that holds the digital economy together. However, the custodian of the National Identity Database- the National Identity Management Commission (NIMC), was not under the supervision of the Minister when he assumed office. However, in August 2020 Mr. President transferred NIMC to the Federal Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy, to be supervised by the Minister, in line with global best practice. The transformation since that period has been so significant that it has elicited accolades from all across the world.

In August 2020, there were just about 39m National Identification Number (NIN) records and these records were from the 2007 when the NIMC Act became a law in Nigeria. By May 2023, the NIN records had grown to about 100m- that is about 61m records in just over 32 months- a remarkable achievement in National Identification Number (NIN) issuance (See Fig. 15).

The Honourable Minister and the NIMC management team made innovation their watch word in NIMC's transformation journey. A case in point was when, on behalf of President Muhammadu Buhari, he **launched three unique digital innovations for supporting NIMC's NIN enrolment process: Tokenisation, NIMC Mobile APP and the contactless enrolment solutions** All three innovative

solutions proved to be novel, not just in Nigeria, but also across the African continent, and this is a reflection of the commitment of the Minister in promoting indigenous solutions that will also stand out globally.

The mobile app allows users to link their NIN to their phones without having to physically visit any telecoms company. It also enables users to download the improved NIN slips and use mobile IDs as a valid and secure means of identification. The tokenisation solution is in line with the efforts of the federal government to enhance data privacy and data security of citizens and legal residents. It prevents verifiers and third parties from storing raw NIN of users. Rather, it provides a time-bound virtual NIN that is specific to the verifying entities. The contactless Android biometric enrolment system provides a portable and convenient approach obtain NINs after providing their biometrics through a process that is swift and contactless.

The importance of digital identity is discussed under Pillar #6 (Soft Infrastructure pillar) of NDEPS. Two other key themes under that pillar is the themes of cybersecurity and data protection & privacy. A robust digital economy is highly reliant on resilient and highly secure infrastructure. To this end, the Honourable Minister, who is also a Professor of Cybersecurity, superintended the strengthening of cybersecurity across the country, both at an institutional and individual (citizen) level.

Two (2) world class computer emergency response teams were established in both the information technology and telecommunication sectors (Fig. 16). In the Information Technology sector, the Computer Emergency Readiness and Response Team (CERRT), managed by NITDA was established and for the telecommunications sector, the Cybersecurity Incidence Response Team (CSIRT) was established.

In due cognisance of the emerging international norm in respect of safeguarding the rights of data subjects to privacy and, also, strengthening data sovereignty through adequate data protection framework, the Hon recommended the creation of the Nigeria Data Protection Bureau.

The President and Commander-in-Chief, Muhammadu Buhari, GCFR approved the said recommendation and the Bureau was, thus, established on the on 4th of February, 2022. The mandate of the Bureau as approved by Mr. President are as follows, among others:

- i. Implementation of the Nigeria Data Protection Regulation;
- ii. Issuance of Guidelines, Standards and Development of Strategies for Data Privacy and Protection;
- iii. Coordination of Data Privacy and Protection Frameworks;
- iv. Coordination of the Process for the passage of Nigeria Data Protection Bill;

- v. Collaboration with stakeholders towards advancing Data Privacy and Protection in Nigeria;
- vi. Capacity Building to create a pool of globally competitive Data Protection experts; and
- vii. Enhance Ease of Doing Business to Attract Foreign Direct Investment.

The new data protection industry created out the Data Protection Regulation has a cumulative earning of N4.08 billion Naira, created 7,680 jobs, licensed 133 Data Protection Compliance Organisation (DPCO) and trained 5,746 persons. A Data Protection Bill has also been drafted and is awaiting passage at the National Assembly.

2.6 Improvement and optimisation of revenues from all operators and licensees in the agencies under the Ministry's supervision

As mentioned earlier, one of the main objectives of redesignating the Ministry and expanding its mandate was to ensure that the economy remained the central focus of the economy. As such, the activities of the digital economy sector are expected to support the traditional economy by boosting GDP, generating revenue and enabling the government to make savings.

The unprecedented contribution of the sector to the GDP has been highlighted earlier. Different initiatives in the sector have attracted foreign direct investment and generated revenue for the government. A case in point is the 5G auctioning process that generated \$820.8m for the Federal Government. In addition to the revenue generated from the 5G spectrum, additional revenue is being generated from other spectrum fees. **For example, in 2020, the sum of Twenty-Six Billion, Four Hundred and Twenty-Eight Million, Six Hundred and Forty-Two Thousand, Four Hundred and Fifty-One Naira, Sixty-One kobo (₦26,428,642,451.61) was generated as Spectrum fees.**

From 2019 to date the National Information Technology Development Agency (NITDA) has evaluated and cleared over 840 major IT projects, saving the government over ₦306 billion.

As part of the execution of this Ministerial deliverable, the Nigerian Postal Service (NIPOST) has been positioned for greater productivity through the establishment of 3 subsidiaries, namely:

- i. Properties and Development Company;
- ii. NIPOST Transport and Logistics Company; and
- iii. NIPOST Microfinance bank Limited

2.7 Active collaboration with the Private Sector to create jobs

In order to support Mr. President's vision of enabling millions of Nigerians to be lifted out of poverty, at the Federal Ministry of Communications and Digital Economy, we adopted the following approaches:

- i. prioritise programmes and projects that can generate direct and indirect jobs; and
- ii. have regular meetings and engagements with technology companies on how to support in the creation of jobs, and to regularly update us on the progress.

This approach has created 2.21million jobs from Q1 2020 and Q3 2022.

2.8 *Empowerment of citizens*

The Nigeria Startup Act, which was facilitated by the Minister, presents an enabling legal environment to develop exportable digital skills to bridge the global talent gap estimated to about \$8.5 trillion in unrealised annual revenue.

As part of the implementation of NDEPS, there is a commitment to build a talent pool of citizens that are highly skilled in digital technologies. **As part of our efforts through initiatives at the level of the Ministry and its parastatals on one hand and through corporate social responsibility (CSR) efforts of the private sector on the other hand, over 999,444 individuals directly between Q1 2020 and Q2 2023, including 32,022 specialists in Blockchain Technology.**

Girls, women, persons living with disability and person living in Internally Displaced Persons (IDP) have been given special attention in order to ensure inclusivity. These efforts have started yielding results. **For example, twice we have supported 2 Nigerian startups, sponsored to the 2nd edition of the LEAP Technology Exhibition in Riyadh, Saudi Arabia, won a combined prize money of \$300,000 after emerging winners in different categories of the Rocket Fuel Pitch Competition at the event.**

The startups – RiceAfrika Technologies and Wicrypt (Fig. 17) – were part of more than 10,000 startups that submitted applications from different countries. After a comprehensive review, the applicants were trimmed to 220 and further trimmed to 90 startups were selected to pitch their business ideas in the semi-final. There were 8 Nigerian startups that participated at the semi-final and 3 reached the final stage.
